We were able to make a difference in her life.


Thankfully the family had the support of generous friends like you on the path to eventually adopting Aranza as a permanent member of the family.

Sindy shares her hopes and dreams that Aranza and Sophia will continue to grow and be the best sisters they can be for one another.



Lighting a Path to a Brighter Future

In January, A Lighted Path, led by President Lori Gobillot, launched a new initiative to serve young adults who have aged out of foster care.

A Lighted Path was formed by St. John the Divine Church. In partnership with DePelchin, Lori and volunteers developed the Adults in Training program, providing resources and opportunities for young adults (ages 18–20) to achieve meaningful goals and reach their full potential.

You see people of all different ages, all different backgrounds, really just sharing fellowship, community and unconditional love.

Adults in Training serves youth in DePelchin's TAGS (Transitioning to Adulthood through Guidance and Support) program, which provides housing and support to 20 young residents who have aged out of foster care and are currently transitioning into adulthood.

Lori pairs youth from the TAGS program with a volunteer from

A Lighted Path, who serves as a resource, mentor and "light" for a young adult.

Every Thursday night, the program offers a life skills class and meal for participants. Here, volunteer professionals cover a range of important topics including financial literacy, managing difficult relationships, navigating college and so much more.


"When we're all together, you see people of all different ages, all different backgrounds, really just sharing fellowship, community and unconditional love," Lori says.

With DePelchin's long history of impact and ability to meet our community's ever-changing needs, Lori felt DePelchin was an ideal partner to support children and youth.

Thanks to the kindness and compassion of people like Lori and the volunteers with A Lighted Path, more youth in our community will have vital resources and opportunities for success.







Raising healthy and happy children is just what Yelina and her husband, William, are working towards, and it's through your support of DePelchin's ParentingHelp program that the couple is gaining the tools needed to make their goal more of a reality.

"It is through these programs that parents are taught how to be more positive and grow healthy and happy children," says Yelina.

Yelina and William have three children, Adam, 4, Liam, 3, and Angeline, 1. When the couple noticed Liam was having difficulty managing his emotions, they spoke to a social worker at Liam's school and received a referral for the ParentingHelp program.

After enrolling in the program, the couple learned how to integrate healthy practices like talking about their emotions to help Liam process them.

"Little by little I was able to help Liam express himself in a healthier manner," Yelina says.

Yelina and William have now taken home new tools including a behavior chart — to better guide Liam and the entire family. This tool has been a game changer, Yelina says, motivating Liam and his siblings to reach their goals in engaging and rewarding ways.

Yelina adds that she looks forward to seeing Liam thrive on his new path to a brighter future.

"My hope is that Liam will grow into an independent, sociable and fearless individual," she says.

You Helped Amari Find His Forever Family

Brianne and TJ trained to become foster parents through DePelchin five years ago and have since served as foster parents for five children, ranging in ages and lengths of stay. But when Amari arrived at just 19 months old, they turned his short-term stay into a permanent home with the help of DePelchin.

"It does make a difference," Brianne says of your support. "You really are setting up these kids for a nurturing, wonderful life."

Brianne continues, "[Being a foster parent] is probably the

hardest thing I've ever done, but it's also the most wonderful thing I've ever done."

She says it's important to remember that opening your home isn't just about the parents but about the other children in the home as well. Long before welcoming their first foster placement, Brianne and TJ spent time openly communicating with their biological kids, Stetson, 12, McCoy, 11 and Autrie, 6.

"It's all of us together and it affects all of us," Brianne says. "If we can just love a child and make this transition a little lighter, a little easier, then it's worth it."

Through a year and a half of visitation and going through the adoption process, the couple can now officially call Amari their son after finalizing his adoption this past June.

Now, Brianne says the family enjoys making lasting memories by taking trips, playing mini golf and swimming. Brianne and TJ are taking a brief break before opening their home again as foster parents through DePelchin.

"Thank you," Brianne says to kind-hearted supporters like you. "Thank you for pouring into these children — that makes a world of difference and makes them feel seen and known."
